Secretary Austin:

We write to follow up on requests for information regarding the origins of COVID-19 that remain outstanding. The Department of Defense (DOD) has an obligation to be responsive to congressional requests for information.

On August 3, 2022, the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Subcommittee on Emerging Threats and Spending Oversight held a hearing titled, "Revisiting Gain of Function Research: What the Pandemic Taught Us and Where Do We Go from Here."

Members of the U.S. Senate have sent letters to DOD, specifically to DARPA and to DTRA, requesting documents and information related to agency's activities and operations. To date, DOD has failed to provide the requested information

For this reason, we reaffirm the following requests for information:

1. Unreducted copies of all records² referring or relating to EcoHealth Alliance, including but not limited to grant proposals, contracts, subcontracts, agreements, and data.

2. Unreducted copies of all records referring or relating to Wuhan Institute of Virology, Shi Zhengli, Zhou Yusen, or Academy for Military Medical Sciences, including but not limited to grant proposals, contracts, subcontracts, agreements, and data.

²"Records" include any written, recorded, or graphic material of any kind, including letters, memoranda, reports, notes, electronic data (emails, email attachments, and any other electronically-created or stored information), calendar entries, inter-office communications, meeting minutes, phone/voice mail or recordings/records of verbal communications, and drafts (whether or not they resulted in final documents).

3. Unreducted copies of all records referring or relating to Ralph Baric, including but not limited to grant proposals, contracts, subcontracts, agreements, and data.

4. Unreducted copies of any application or submission since 2014 relating to coronavirus research, including but not limited to accepted proposals, rejected proposals, and proposals to add a furin cleavage site to coronaviruses.

We respectfully request you provide our offices with the status of each request no later than 5:00 PM on April 10, 2023.
