2 SEC. ____. PROHIBITION ON FOREIGN ASSISTANCE TO THE

3 PALESTINIAN AUTHORITY OR ANY OTHER
4 PALESTINIAN GOVERNING ENTITY IN THE
5 WEST BANK AND GAZA.

6 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-7 ings:

8 (1) On October 7, 2023, the terrorist organiza9 tion Hamas conducted a brutal attack against
10 Israel, killing some 1,200 innocent men, women, and

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1	children, and taking approximately 250 people hos-
2	tage.
3	(2) At least 33 United States citizens lost their
4	lives in the October 7, 2023, attack.
5	(3) At least 6 United States citizens remain un-
6	accounted for and presumed taken captive by
7	Hamas.
8	(4) Hamas continues to fire rockets indiscrimi-
9	nately toward Israel.
10	(5) Hamas was designated as a foreign terrorist
11	organization by the United States in October 1997.
12	(6) On November 26, 2023, a spokesperson for
13	the Israel Defense Forces said that 770 "terrorism
14	events" were carried out by Palestinians in the West
15	Bank since October 7, 2023, including shootings and
16	hurling stones and Molotov cocktails.
17	(7) The United States provided more than
18	\$7,600,000,000 in bilateral assistance to Palestin-
19	ians in the West Bank and Gaza since 1993.
20	(8) The United States obligated more than
21	\$280,000,000 to the West Bank and Gaza in 2023.
22	(9) The Department of State's West Bank and
23	Gaza 2022 Human Rights Report identified signifi-
24	cant human rights issues with respect to the Pales-
25	tinian Authority, including credible reports of unlaw-

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ful or arbitrary killings by Palestinian Authority of ficials, torture or cruel, inhumane, or degrading
 treatment or punishments by Palestinian Authority
 officials, arbitrary arrest or detention of political
 prisoners and detainees, and significant problems
 with the independence of the judiciary.

7 (10) The report identified the Palestinian Au8 thority committing arbitrary or unlawful interference
9 with privacy; serious restrictions on freedom of ex10 pression and media, including violence, threats of vi11 olence, unjustified detentions and prosecutions of
12 journalists, and censorship; and serious restrictions
13 on internet freedom.

(11) The report identified the Palestinian Authority committing substantial interference with the
freedom of peaceful assembly and freedom of association, including harassment of nongovernmental
organizations, serious and unreasonable restrictions
on political participation, including no national elections since 2006, and serious government corruption.

(12) The report found that the Palestinian Authority did not adequately investigate or hold accountable gender-based violence, and crimes, violence, and threats of violence motivated by anti-Semitism.

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(b) PROHIBITION ON ASSISTANCE TO PALESTINIAN
 AUTHORITY AND OTHER GOVERNING ENTITIES IN THE
 WEST BANK AND GAZA.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided under
5 paragraph (2) and notwithstanding any other provi6 sion of law, no amounts may be obligated or ex7 pended to provide any direct United States assist8 ance, loan guarantee, or debt relief to the Pales9 tinian Authority or any other Palestinian governing
10 entity in the West Bank and Gaza.

11 (2) EXCEPTION.—The prohibition under para12 graph (1) shall have no effect for a fiscal year if the
13 President certifies to Congress during that fiscal
14 year that—

15 (A) the Palestinian Authority, or other
16 Palestinian governing entity in the West Bank
17 and Gaza, has—

18 (i) formally recognized the right of19 Israel to exist as a Jewish state;

20 (ii) publicly recognized the state of
21 Israel;

- 22 (iii) renounced terrorism;23 (iv) purged all individuals with ter-
- 24 rorist ties from security services;

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1	(v) terminated funding of anti-Amer-
2	ican and anti-Israel incitement;
3	(vi) publicly renounced Hamas and
4	the October 7, 2023, attacks perpetrated
5	by Hamas on Israel; and
6	(vii) honored previous diplomatic
7	agreements; and
8	(B) all hostages abducted on October 7,
9	2023, and held in territory governed by the Pal-
10	estinian Authority or other Palestinian gov-
11	erning authority have been released.
12	(c) Request for Information on Human Rights
13	PRACTICES BY THE PALESTINIAN AUTHORITY OR ANY
14	Other Palestinian Governing Entity in the West
15	Bank and Gaza.—
16	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after
17	the date of the adoption of this resolution, the Sec-
18	retary of State, in collaboration with the Assistant
19	Secretary of State for Democracy, Human Rights,
20	and Labor and the Office of the Legal Adviser, shall
21	submit to the Committee on Foreign Relations of
22	the Senate and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of
23	the House of Representatives a report on the human
24	rights practices of the Palestinian Authority, or any

1	other Palestinian governing entity in the West Bank
2	and Gaza.
3	(2) ELEMENTS.—The report required under
4	paragraph (1) shall include—
5	(A) all available credible information con-
6	cerning alleged violations of internationally rec-
7	ognized human rights by the Palestinian Au-
8	thority or any other Palestinian governing enti-
9	ty in the West Bank and Gaza, including—
10	(i) the denial of the right to life to
11	Israeli citizens, Jewish individuals, women
12	and girls, or any other minority group; and
13	(ii) the use of torture or cruel, inhu-
14	mane, or degrading treatment or punish-
15	ment, prolonged detention without charges
16	and trial, causing the disappearance of
17	persons by the abduction and clandestine
18	detention of those persons, and other fla-
19	grant denial of the right to life, liberty, or
20	the security of person;
21	(B) a description of the steps that the
22	United States Government has taken to—
23	(i) promote respect for and observance
24	of human rights as part of the activities of
25	the Palestinian Authority or any other Pal-

1	estinian governing entity in the West Bank
2	and Gaza;
3	(ii) discourage any practices that are
4	inimical to internationally recognized
5	human rights; and
6	(iii) publicly or privately call attention
7	to, and disassociate the United States and
8	any foreign assistance provided for the
9	Palestinian Authority or any other Pales-
10	tinian governing entity in the West Bank
11	and Gaza from, any practices described in
12	clause (ii);
13	(C) a description of the intended uses of
14	all foreign assistance provided by the United
15	States to the Palestinian Authority or any other
16	Palestinian governing entity in the West Bank
17	and Gaza; and
18	(D) a list of international organizations
19	that—
20	(i) accept financial contributions from
21	the United States Government; and
22	(ii) provide assistance of any kind to
23	the Palestinian Authority or any other Pal-
24	estinian governing entity in the West Bank
25	and Gaza.
