Section	Section Title	Description	Appropriation
90001(a)(1)	Border Wall System	\$6.5 billion is designated to CBP for the construction, or improvement of primary, waterborne, and secondary border barriers; development of access roads; and incorporation of system components such as cameras, lights, sensors, and other detection technologies. According to the CBP website, the cost to construct a new border wall or replace existing legacy fence is approximately \$6.5 million per mile. ¹	\$6.500 billion
90001(a)(2)	CBP Facilities	\$2.5 billion for the lease, acquisition, construction, or improvement of CBP facilities and checkpoints near the southwest, northern, and maritime borders. The section also prohibits any of these funds from being used to surveil U.S. citizens.	\$2.500 billion
90002(a)	CBP Personnel	\$2.04 billion for hiring and training additional Border Patrol agents, Office of Field Operations officers, Air and Marine agents, rehired annuitants, and support personnel for nonimmigration functions.	\$2.035 billion
90002(b)	CBP Retention and Signing Bonuses	\$1.03 billion is provided for retention and signing bonuses for Border Patrol agents, Office of Field Operations officers, Air and Marine agents, rehired annuitants, and support personnel for nonimmigration functions.	\$1.026 billion
90002(c)	CBP Vehicles	\$375 million for the repair, lease, or acquisition of vehicles for CBP agents and officers. The WH requested funding for 10,300 vehicles.	\$0.375 billion
90003(a)(1)	Non-Intrusive Inspection (NII) Equipment	\$538 million for procurement and integration of non-intrusive inspection systems equipment.	\$0.538 billion
90003(a)(2)	Border Technology	\$1.38 billion for border technology upgrades.	\$1.383 billion
90003(a)(3)	Biometric Entry/Exit	\$288 million for biometric entry and exit systems at ports-of-entry. This section includes limitations prohibiting the use of funds for surveilling U.S. citizens or for creating a database that includes U.S. citizens.	\$0.288 billion
90003(b)	Air and Marine Interdiction	\$617 million for upgrading and procuring maritime and aviation assets under CBP's Air and Marine Operations.	\$0.617 billion
90004(a)	Detention Capacity	\$22.5 billion to ICE for expanding detention capacity for both single adult aliens and families. It authorizes the use of family residential centers to detain individuals pending removal proceedings or while awaiting removal after a final order.	\$22.500 billion

90005(a)	Presidential Residence Protection	\$240 million to FEMA to reimburse state and local law enforcement agencies for extraordinary protection costs associated with safeguarding Presidential residences	\$0.240 billion
90006(a)	State Homeland Security Grant Program	\$180 million to FEMA to the existing State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP), which Operation Stonegarden is under, to issue grants to state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies for coordination on border security. There is a limitation that the funding may not be used for surveillance of U.S. citizens.	\$0.180 billion
90007	Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) Retention and Signing Bonuses	\$19.5 million to ICE to fund annual retention and signing bonuses for agents and support staff within HSI engaged in nonimmigration functions.	\$0.020 billion
90008	HSI & Support Personnel	\$456.5 million for ICE to hire additional HSI agents and support personnel for non-immigration activities.	\$0.457 billion
90009(a)	IT Investments	\$350 million for ICE's procurement and repair of information technology systems. Funding is restricted from being used to surveil U.S. citizens.	\$0.350 billion
90010	ICE Facilities	\$275 million for the lease, acquisition, construction, or improvement of ICE facilities.	\$0.275 billion
